Irrigation Meter Installation Instructions

If you have an irrigation system, the District will make adjustments based on water usage on an approved water meter installed on the irrigation line.

To qualify for this adjustment, the customer needs to do the following:

Step 1. Purchase a water meter from the District. As of 2021, this is a requirement. The District will sell you a meter based on the size that you need to have metered at cost plus sales tax. For most installations, a single 5/8” meter will be able to meter all of your irrigation uses.

Step 2. You need a permit from the Town of Kennebunk. If you do not already have backflow prevention, you will need to have your plumber install it.

Step 3. The meters can be installed by the owner, contractor, or plumber. The District will not install the meters.

Step 4. The owner or installer need to make sure that that the meter is only measuring water used by the irrigation meter. For example, if there is a bathroom or washing machine that is supplied by water downstream of the irrigation meter, the District will not give the owner credit for water used.

Step 5. Install the meter in a location that it can be easily read and can be photographed, and,

Step 6. Arrange for a District representative to do a final inspection. The District representative will only be looking for a proper, permanent installation that is metering the water delivered to the irrigation system. They will take a photograph of the installation for our records. The District will only do inspections on Fridays by appointment and the owner should give the District a 48-hour notice.
